News from NED University of Engineering & Technology

- **Prof. Dr. S.F.A. Rafeeqi,** Dean, Departments of Civil Engineering and Architecture at the NED University of Engineering and Technology, informed that the Department of Civil Engineering has been able to win two Higher Education Commission (HEC) and US Agency for International Development (USAID) funded grants in the amount of US\$450,000 related to Construction Management with Florida University, USA and Earthquake Engineering with Stanford and Berkeley University, California, USA.
- The NED University of Engineering and Technology in collaboration with the US Agency for International Development (USAID) and the University of Mississippi, USA has initiated a three-year research project on "Karachi Metropolitan Intelligent-based Transportation System" for the proper management of vehicular traffic in the city. - According to NEDUET Website the "Old City Campus Restoration Project" is underway and being carried out on international principles of conservation under the supervision of trained conservation experts. The initial stages of the project are financed by the university itself, but to be able to take the project to completion, more funds are required.

The approach of the University is to generate a variety of educational activities within the Old Campus premises. The University plans to develop a campus for the Department of Architecture and Planning. In addition, there is a plan to build a conference hall, an exhibition hall and a small gallery for exhibit of photographers and other materials related to the Old City Campus Building and the University. 
